


3. The program

After the coordinator welcome’s talk prof. Vassilios Fanos from the University of Cagliari gave a nice presentation about the dissemination activities for the project, e.g. website (see deliverable 6.1) and social media activities.

Thereafter Christine Marking introduced GAMIAN-Europe, a patient organization and as partner organization involved in the project. It was decided that the website should also have information aimed at the lay audience, either patients, their families or policy makers.

The rest of the morning the ESR students and projects were introduced by each PI or supervisor. Possibilities for further collaborations were discussed.



After the lunch break the ESR training & secondment schedules were discussed.

Parallel to the discussion about the secondments the members of the scientific advisory board had a private meeting to review the project objects and aims.

The second day of the meeting started with a discussion about the upcoming deliverables, like the polygenetic risk scores, data harmonisation and data facility to facilitate analyses across sites. The consortium appeared to be well on track to reach the deliverables.

After the break the advisory board presented their feedback about the project, which was a very positive feedback. They also provided some recommendations which will be implemented during the next day.
